PRESENTATION

All communities around the world today are confronted with the major challenge of either promoting economic models that have devastated entire ecosystems—due to energy-mining extractivism, violence, and illegal economies—or the possibility of enhancing and fostering economies that promote life, social justice, and the restoration of life.

Life-affirming economies are those that are woven together in territories, hand in hand with solidarity-based, popular, and community organizations. These economies not only promote productive processes for subsistence and economic and political sovereignty but also protect water, rivers, and páramos (high Andean ecosystems).

These life-affirming economies require a space to meet and develop agendas aimed at regional and international coordination, to promote the collective efforts of social and solidarity movements that allow for increased empowerment and the development of public and private instruments to safeguard life on the planet.

In this context, Cali (Colombia) will host the **COP16** on biodiversity, a unique opportunity to hold the **International Meeting on Economies for Life – ECOOVIDA2024.** This gathering will bring together social, popular, and solidarity movements so that their voices can be heard by governments and international organizations within the framework of the global agenda for diversity and well-being.

ECOOVIDA 2024 is a joint effort of various international platforms for social, solidaritybased, popular, and community economies, which, with the support of the Government of Colombia, are coming together in a collective effort to materialize the necessary coordination and place life-affirming economies at the center of global and local development strategies.

These platforms include the World Social Forum on Transformative Economies – FSMET; the Intercontinental Network for the Promotion of Social and Solidarity Economy – RIPESS; La Vía Campesina; the International Labor Organization (ILO); the Global Forum on Social and Solidarity Economy – GSEF; the Latin American Confederation of Worker Cooperatives and Mutuals – COLACOT; the Latin American Agroecological Movement – MAELA; the Campaign for a Global Curriculum of Social and Solidarity Economy; the UNESCO Chair of Social and Solidarity Economy studies – Rulescoop, as well as various other international and national movements and organizations.

Additionally, **the Colombia Steering Committee** is comprised of the country's leading organizations and unions in cooperativism, mutualism, employee funds, foundations, and associations.
